

Château Latour-Laguens Cuvée Bois Noir

In the XVIth century, the Château was property of King Henry IV of France, also known by the epithet "Good King Henry".

The vineyard is situated on the clayey hills of *Monplaisir Valley* allowing ideal conditions for the development and production of high quality grapes: vines are bathed in sunlight and rain water runs down along the slopes.

Chateau Latour-Laguens *Cuvée Bois Noir* wine is a blend of Merlot, Cabernet-Sauvignon and Carmenère located on a 50 years old plot.

Manual sorting is done on the fully ripe (though not overripe) grapes, fermentation takes place in small stainless steel tanks and aging in French oak barrels for 12 to 14 months.

The color is dark with purple glints, aromas of blackberry, spices and vanilla, mouth is round, silky and long lasting.
